With millions of people under Nazi control, what measures did Hitler promulgate to extend his ideology beyond the borders of his own country, to bring the subject nations into a pan-German racial state that would be free of Jews, Slavs, and other non-Aryans. In seeking answers to these questions, Norman Rich carries his study of Hitler's war aims to the actual policies implemented in the countries that came under German occupation before and during the Second World War. In doing so, he provides a fitting sequel to his previous volume on Hitler's diplomatic and military ventures, a work that was hailed by H. R. Trevor-Roper as amply documented, thoroughly scholarly in method, scrupulous in detail; sensible in judgment. After an opening chapter that describes the treatment of the Jews in German society, the focus shifts to the government and administration of the conquered countries ranging from those nations with a...
